CCXXVI Special Awards & Trophies

Compete for the following awards and trophies—please note that some require you enter ahead of time.

- SIR EDVOV AWARD: To the First Place PB Stallion aged 20 & Over. Or to the PB Stallion 10 to 19 if there are no entries in PB Stallions 20 & Over. Donated each year by JSM Arabians, Dr. & Mrs. James Miller and Buzz & CJ Ferlan to honor their stallion Sir Edvov.
- AL-MARAH COUNTESS ANNE TEE AWARD: To the First Place PB Mare 20 & Over. Or to the First Place PB Mare 10 to 19 if there are no entries in PB Mares 20 & Over. Donated by Fairfield Farm, the Moore Family, to honor their foundation mare Al-Marah Countess Anne Tee.
- THE Dr. JOHN ALDRED AWARDS: To the Winner of the Judged Leadline Classes, to honor Dr. John Aldred. Two leadline trophys: Leadline 7 & Under, Ponied Leadline 10 & Under.
- THE ANNIE'S ANGEL AWARD: To the High Scoring Purebred Weanling Filly. Donated by Whispering Hope Farm in Memory of WH Annie's Angel.
- THE KARMA ARABIANS VERSATILITY AWARD IN HONOR OF KM ARISTOSON+//: Open to purebred, Half Arab, or Anglo-Arab. Horse must be signed up for this award before noon on Saturday. Includes seven (7) divisions: Hunter/English, Western, Dressage, Western Dressage, Sport Horse In-Hand & Halter, Sport Horse Under Saddle, Trail In-Hand & Under Saddle and Mounted Games. More than one handler/rider can participate with the same horse. The highest total score will determine the winner of the "Most Versatile Arabian" and will be determined by totaling the highest score of each horse from each of five divisions. If a horse is ridden/handled in more than one class in a division, only one of the scores in that division will be used. The AHA points system will be used--one point for entering the ring and one point for each horse that you place above: i.e. if there are 12 horses in the class and your horse places 2nd, the horse would get 11 points for that class; one (1) point for entering the ring and ten (10) points for placing higher than 10 horses. Enter no later than Noon, Saturday, August 17, 2019. There will be a form available for you to record your divisions/scores. Sponsored by Dr. Karlan Downing and Ray Lemaster.
- THE AL-MARAH CUP: To the Highest Scoring Purebred Arabian in the individual Breeding Classes, bred by the current owner. A perpetual trophy originally donated by Bazy Tankersley of Al-Marah Arabians, and now donated by her son Mark Miller.
- NOT TOO EXTREME COWBOY RACE: To the winner of the class. A perpetual trophy given by Dr. Terry Aldred Kerr. Timed class over modified trail course.
- THE KARMA ARABIANS AGED GELDING AWARD: To the First Place Purebred Gelding aged 20 & Over. Or to the First Place Gelding 10 to 19 if there are no entries in the PB Geldings 20 & Over. Donated by Dr. Karlan Downing and Ray Lemaster in honor of KM Aristoson +//.
- ECAHS' MOST CLASSIC ARABIAN AWARD: To the winner of the class "Most Classic Arabian." Donated by Dr. Karlan Downing and Ray Lemaster in honor of PHP AZAAD++.

Coates Creek Challenge Results 2019

The Coates Creek Challenge Rides were held June 29 and 30, in Creemore Ontario. A total of twelve horses entered to win the ECAHS Achievement Awards; however, three of the

twelve did not meet the 25% Crabbet bloodline requirement.

The winner of the 80 km (50 mile) Endurance on Saturday was Barts Five Star Admiral (Vondar Black Bart x Opening Act) ridden by Jessica Retzleff. Barts Five Star Admiral is 27.76% Crabbet. There were 27 riders entered and Barts Five Star Admiral finished 2nd with a time of 5 hours 35 minutes.

The 40 km (25 mile) Limited Distance ride on Sunday was also won by Barts Five Star Admiral. Sixteen riders entered and sixteen finished. Barts Five Star Admiral finished 1st with a time of 2 hours 59 minutes.

An honorable mention to Cathy Nooyen riding Out of the Flames CS who completed her first 100 mile ride. Out of the Flames CS was just shy of qualifying at 23.36% Crabbet and this was her first 100 mile completion.

Bella Imbeault, our only Junior Rider to enter this year, on Impiril Norsk (Bey Imprimis x Klassique Norsk) did not finish.

An open letter from Betty Finke about last year's Benefactor of the Breed Award!

December 20, 2018

Dear Buzz,

now that things are quietening down again, I can finally find a moment to sit down and thank you for sending me the beautiful plaque; as well as for the honor that goes with it, which I am not sure I deserve.

Thank you also for sending the program of your 25th anniversary celebration, which I very much regret I was unable to attend. I am sure it was a wonderful occasion. It is great to know that other kinds of shows are still going on, not only those featured in glossy magazines. Since the original breed shows have turned into outwardly glamorous, but inwardly hollow beauty contests, genuine horse shows are more necessary than ever, especially those showcasing the Arabian as a riding horse. People have to be reminded that Arabian horses are more than pretty faces, they need to know about the essential, genuine virtues of the Arabian that are increasingly in danger of being lost.

I regard it as my duty to keep this knowledge alive through my writing, but it is people like you, your association, and the breeders that belong to it, who are the true benefactors of the breed, by refusing to follow the dictates of fashion and continuing to breed and support the traditional Crabbet Arabian as an all-round useful as well as a beautiful horse.
