Easter's Dam, Al-Marah Mytern, was the daughter of Ibngidason of AM and out of AM Least Tern, who, if my memory serves me, Mrs. T said was her first million dollar horse, she an AM Sea Captain ++ daughter out of Al-Marah Chickadee.

I believe Easter's bloodlines would be a valuable addition to someone's Crabbet breeding program. Easter is a little nervous about touching her legs and belly, which is my fault, because I just haven't spent enough time with her to desensitize her. But she stands well for the farrier and vet. She is a mare who clearly wants to bond with her special person, and she clearly deserves to have such a person, who will love her the rest of her life.

It is my desire to find Easter a good home that will give her a good life, though it will break my heart to part with any of my girls. Under no circumstances do I want any of them to end up in a situation that could result in them going to the killers. I will take back any horse that I place if the new owner is dissatisfied with them.

One of my pet peeves is when a registered horse changes hands and the new ownership is not transferred and registered with AHA. Therefore, I will pay the Transfer Fee to make sure that happens, and request the new owner to do the same, if there is a further transfer. I hate to see horses lost to history because owners fail to transfer papers.

The horses are shedding out well now, and they line up for their turns for grooming sessions.




