We are honored that Carol Mulder asked us to publish this material to the ECAHS community.

A bit of information about Carol Mulder's deep roots with Arabian horses:
(extract from her recent letter to ECAHS; used with permission)

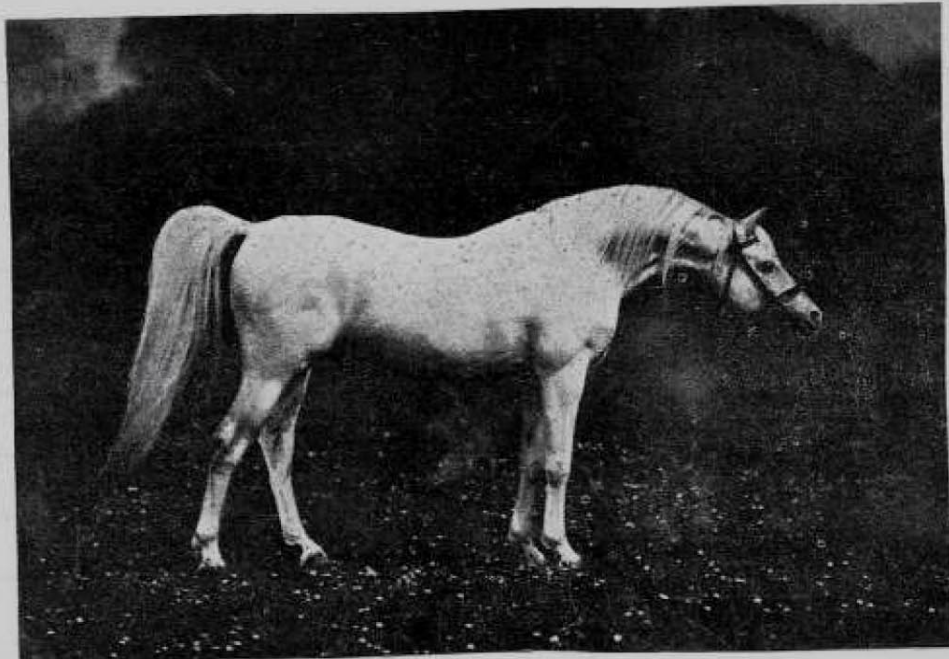
From my birth I was raised around the old (1925-1963) Kellogg Arabian Horse Ranch at Pomona, California. I remained associated with that establishment for my first 28 years which was during the period when it was one of the most important and influential Arabian breeding establishments in the U.S. I began quite carefully collecting and cataloguing research data about the Arabian horse when I was about 12 years old—which was about 78 years ago. I still have all of it. I sort of think I may be the only person involved with Arabian horses today who can say that one of my best childhood horse friends, that I knew well for many years, was a stallion foaled in 1916 (106 years ago), whose sire I believe was foaled in 1888 (that was 134 years ago). I am talking about Jadaan 196—very famous and widely known in his time, but hardly anybody today knows of him. (By the way—Jadaan was a beautiful horse, very typy, and as absolutely wonderful gentle, sensible, and unflappable disposition.)



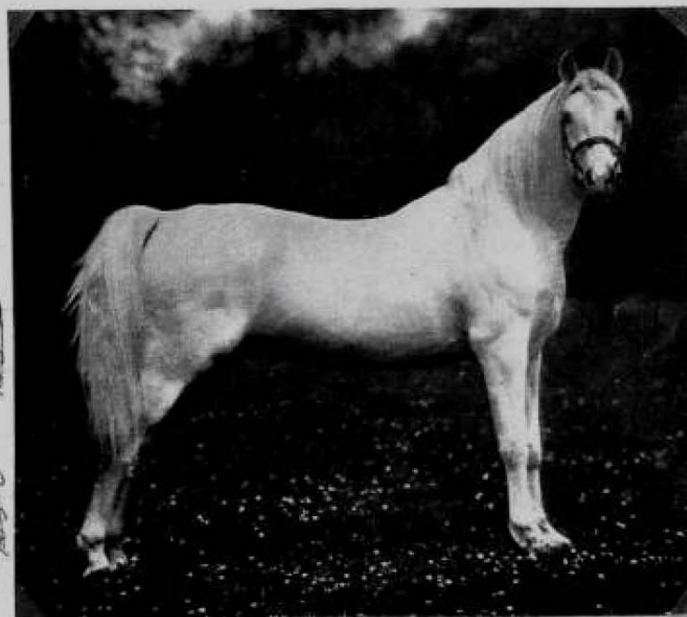

†#1 Note about NUDRAT:

Nudrat, a gray stallion, was evidently foaled in East Africa in 1921.

There is no record of Nudrat in either the GSB or AHSB, but his dam, Nadra, in foal to Skowronek, was sold by Lady Wentworth, owner of Crabbet, to East Africa in 1921; the sale information is according to Nadra's entry in AHSB Volume 2, page 135. Nadra (Sotamm x Nasra) was a 1916 brown mare bred by Crabbet. She appears in GSB Volume 23, named, under produce of her dam, Nasra; otherwise Nadra does not appear again in the GSB.

Some unidentified person has discovered the name, Nudrat, of this stallion in East Africa.

†#2 Note about JALILA:

Jalila was a 1922 gray mare. Her dam was GSB registered *Rasima 606 (Daoud x Rose of Hind), 1917 chestnut mare bred by Crabbet. Jalila was recorded in Volume 25 of the GSB as the 1922 unnamed gray produce filly of *Rasima; Jalila was clearly stated to have been bred by Crabbet and in Volume 26 of the GSB this filly was identified as Jalila.

It appears that in 1922, before the birth of Jalila, Crabbet had sold *Rasima to the Hon. Mrs. C. H. Strutt, Blunt's Hall, Witham, Essex, England. In 1922 the filly was registered in Volume 2, page 146, of the AHSB stud book; she is there named Rama, a 1922 gray with a blaze, shown as bred and owned by the Hon. Mrs. C. H. Strutt. In England it was common practice to name the owner of mare at time of foaling as breeder of the foal, although this was not done in the United States where owner of mare at time of conception of the foal has been considered the breeder. However, it is interesting that - as has already been pointed out - the GSB shows the breeder of *Rasima's 1922 foal as Crabbet. In this case it seems to indicate that Crabbet had not sold the in utero Skowronek filly with her dam, *Rasima, but had retained ownership of the baby, who was Jalila.

It appears that Lady Wentworth of Crabbet very soon got the 1922 *Rasima filly back and - regardless of the AHSB registration - named her Jalila in the GSB. Jalila was a valuable part of the Crabbet broodmare band for some years before eventually being sold to Spain.

Mrs. Strutt owned *Rasima for a few years before Lady Wentworth reacquired her and then in 1926 sold her to W. K. Kellogg of Pomona, California.

It appears quite definitely that Jalila and Rama were one and the same individual.

†#3 Note about SHELIFA:

Shelifa, a gray foaled in 1922, bred at Crabbet, appears in the GSB as Shelifa, but in the AHSB she appears in Volume 2, page 181, as Syringa, a gray foaled in 1922, bred and owned by Lady Wentworth at Crabbet. No markings are shown for her. It is not known how or why this name change happened for Shelifa's AHSB registration.

The dam of Shelifa/Syringa was Selima [1908] (*Astrald 238 x Selma II), a 1908 brown mare bred by Crabbet; Selima [1908] appears in GSB consistently through her entire life with full information of her production record. The GSB is quite clear in stating that Selima [1908] had only one foal, ever, by Skowronek - and that foal was 1922 gray Shelifa; she is clearly identified as Shelifa in the GSB.

There are some people who believe that Shelifa and Syringa existed as two separate entities and were therefore twins, but GSB records clearly belie that incorrect assumption and in any case there is no further record of Syringa after her 1922 registration with the AHSB.

According to GSB Volume 26, in 1926 Shelifa produced a gray colt, Black Tom, by Chevalier, who was evidently a Thoroughbred; Black Tom was evidently bred by Crabbet. In 1930 Shelifa was sold by Crabbet to the Duke of Veragua, Spain.

†#4 Note about *RAIDA 600:

*Raida 600 was a gray mare.

She is shown in both GSB and American registry records as a gray sired by either bay Nadir or gray Skowronek. Her dam, Rabla, was a bay. In 1922 when *Raida was foaled, it was not understood that a gray horse had to have at least one gray parent, but this later became widely known as a proven genetic fact. Therefore, it is obvious that *Raida was sired by Skowronek.

*Raida's bay dam was Rabla (Mesaoud x Rosemary), bred by Crabbet and foaled in 1899. Rabla was GSB registered; the GSB stud book entries for her clearly show her entire production record.

After *Raida's birth, Crabbet gave away her 23 year old dam, Rabla - evidently to Brigadier-General F. F. Lance of Wentfield, Wrotham, Kent - but retained ownership of *Raida.

However, it appears that Briadier-General Lance may have thought he owned Rabla's 1922 filly (*Raida) too. In any case, he appears to have registered the filly in 1922 with the AHSB, where she appears in Volume 2, page 142; this volume of the stud book was published in 1922. There she is named Rabun, foaled in 1922, and bred by Crabbet. Her owner is shown as Brigadier-General F. F. Lance. Her sire is correctly named as Skowronek, and Rabun is further described in her AHSB entry as a bay with gray hairs (a gray who was foaled in the adult shade of bay), marked with a star. *Raida is known to have been marked with a star - but also with a left front coronet.

There are some who believe that *Raida/Rabun were twins. This was not so; it seems they were one and the same individual - *Raida 600 - as shown above. The GSB which records Rabla's foal of 1922 is clear that the filly was a single foal. The believers of the twin idea suggest that *Raida may have been foaled in January 1922 and Rabun foaled in December 1922, but that could not have been the case because Volume 2 of the AHSB stud book was published in 1922 and so had to be prepared and ready for publishing before December for the book to come out in 1922.

Rabla died in 1924.

*Raida was imported to the United States in 1926 by W. K. Kellogg at Pomona, California; Kellogg had purchased her from Crabbet.

†#5 Note about CONSUL'S BINT:

Consul's Bint is shown in the GSB, Volume 24, page 952, as a 1919 bay filly sired by Mootrub Consolide x Ruth Kesia, and bred by Mr. S. G. Hough, England. This appearance of Consul's Bint in the GSB is only in the listing of her dam's produce; Consul's Bint evidently does not appear under her own heading in the GSB.

The only named appearance in the GSB of Consul Bint's sire, Mootrub Consolide, is in produce of dam listings:

- Ruth Kesia produced 3 foals by Mootrub Consolide; the others, besides Consul's Bint, were 1915 gray filly, Fumitory, bred by H. C. Stephens and sent to Egypt, and 1916 unnamed bay colt, also bred by Mr. Stephens; this colt's fate is unknown.
- Sheeba was barren to Mootrub Consolide in 1917; that foal would have been bred by Mr. H. C. Stephens. Sheeba then produced an unnamed 1918 bay colt by Mootrub Consolide; this colt was bred by Capt. L. Edmunds and his fate is unknown. In 1919 Sheeba produced Bruin, a chestnut colt bred by Mr. S. G. Hough and sired by Mootrub Consolide; the fate of Bruin is unknown.

In searching through possible identities for Mootrub Consolide, the results are narrowed to only two most likely possibilities. The reasons the search results narrowed on these two are:

- Both were foaled within the proper time frame to have been able to sire Consul's Bint and the others (mentioned above).
- Both were bred by Mr. H. C. Stephens, a name connected with use of Mootrub Consolide. Mr. S. G. Hough acquired some Arabians from Mr. Stephens.
- Both candidate colts were sired by Mootrub; it seems logical to think that Mootrub was likely the sire of Mootrub Consolide (although chestnut Mootrub Hafid was sired by the Mootrub son Shahzada; further, Mootrub Hafid was foaled in 1921, too late to have been sired by Mootrub, and bred by H. F. Musgrave Clark, a name apparently not associated with Mootrub Consolide).

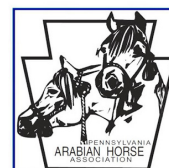
The two candidate colts, one of which might possibly have been Mootrub Consolide, were both out of Jebel Shammar, and so were full-brothers. In the GSB both appear as unnamed on their dam's produce list: They were a 1912 bay and a 1913 brown. In 1918, when Ruth Kesia was covered to produce 1919 Consul's Bint, these stallions would have been 6 and 5 years old.

Their dam, Jebel Shammar, was an 1897 by mare sired by Hail x Jebal Druz, and bred by Miss Ethelred Dillon, England.

Jebel Druz was an 1884 bay mare by Kars x Jedrania, and bred by "Mr W. S. Blunt" (meaning Wilfrid Blunt, Crabbet Stud).

The GSB stud book was not organized to make it efficiently possible to check get of sires; stallions were not even given their own entries in the GSB (unless they were imported, but those entries never included get). The GSB was arranged only by mare entries, listing them and their produce. Thus, many produce were "lost," sometimes without ever even receiving recorded names, and male produce appearing only later as sires of the produce of mares, in which case no breeding for the sires of the mares' foals was mentioned at all. This situation made the GSB both cumbersome and of rather narrowly restricted use. The GSB was not "user friendly."
